More About Dr. David Cooperrider

David Cooperrider is Professor and Chairman of the Department of Organizational Behaviour at the Weatherhead School of Management at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio.

David first created the Appreciative Inquiry concepts in 1986 for his doctoral thesis: 'Appreciative Inquiry: Toward a Methodology for Utilizing and Enhancing Organizational Innovation.' In subsequent years he worked with a number of colleagues from all over the world to develop additional concepts in support of the Appreciative Inquiry principles.

Today, he serves as advisor to many organizations, including Yellow Roadway Corporation, Green Mountain Coffee Roasters, the United States Navy, the EPA's Office of Research and Development and the American Red Cross.

David was recognized in 2000 as among the "Top Ten Visionaries" in the field by *Training Magazine*, and in 2004 he received the prestigious Distinguished Contribution to Workplace Learning and Performance Award from the American Society for Training and Development for "distinguished contribution" to the field of organizational learning.

Among his highest honors David was invited to design a series of dialogues among 25 of the world's top religious leaders, started by His Holiness the
Dalai Lama who said,
"If only the world's
religious leaders could
just know each other,
the world will be a
better place." Using
Al, the group has had
meetings in Jerusalem
and at the Carter
Centre with President
Jimmy Carter in
Atlanta.



The United Nations sought out Professor Cooperrider for his expertise in applying Appreciative Inquiry in bringing about consensus among large groups of people. He facilitated a meeting of 500 world leaders at the United Nations for the Global Compact Leaders Summit last year in New York City

Many of his clients have also received awards for their work with Appreciative Inquiry. For example, GTE was recently recognized by ASTD for the Best Organization Change Program in the country.

About Business as an Agent of World Benefit

Business as an Agent of World Benefit (BAWB) is a worldwide action-research project, convened by Case Western Reserve University and a growing number of partners.

BAWB is a "call to inquiry" where people from every culture and society are invited to participate—and which uses Appreciative Inquiry (AI) to discover organizational innovations at the intersection of business and society.

Academically, the project is designed to link with the United States' Global Change Research Program and the new field of Positive Organizational Scholarship, where paramount focus is being placed on helping the world understand and

make the massive transition from the unsustainable present to a sustainable economy and ecology of organizations, societies, and cultures. The magnitude of this, what some have called the extraordinary challenge of our generation, will call for a re-thinking of the world economy—business essentially—which has become one of the most capacity filled forces on the planet. Obviously, today such capacity is being used for both good and ill. BAWB's search and commitment is to elevate and expand the positive organizational scholarship opportunities of the former and to do so in ways that are rigourous, relevant, globally inclusive, and value-enriching for leaders of business and society.
